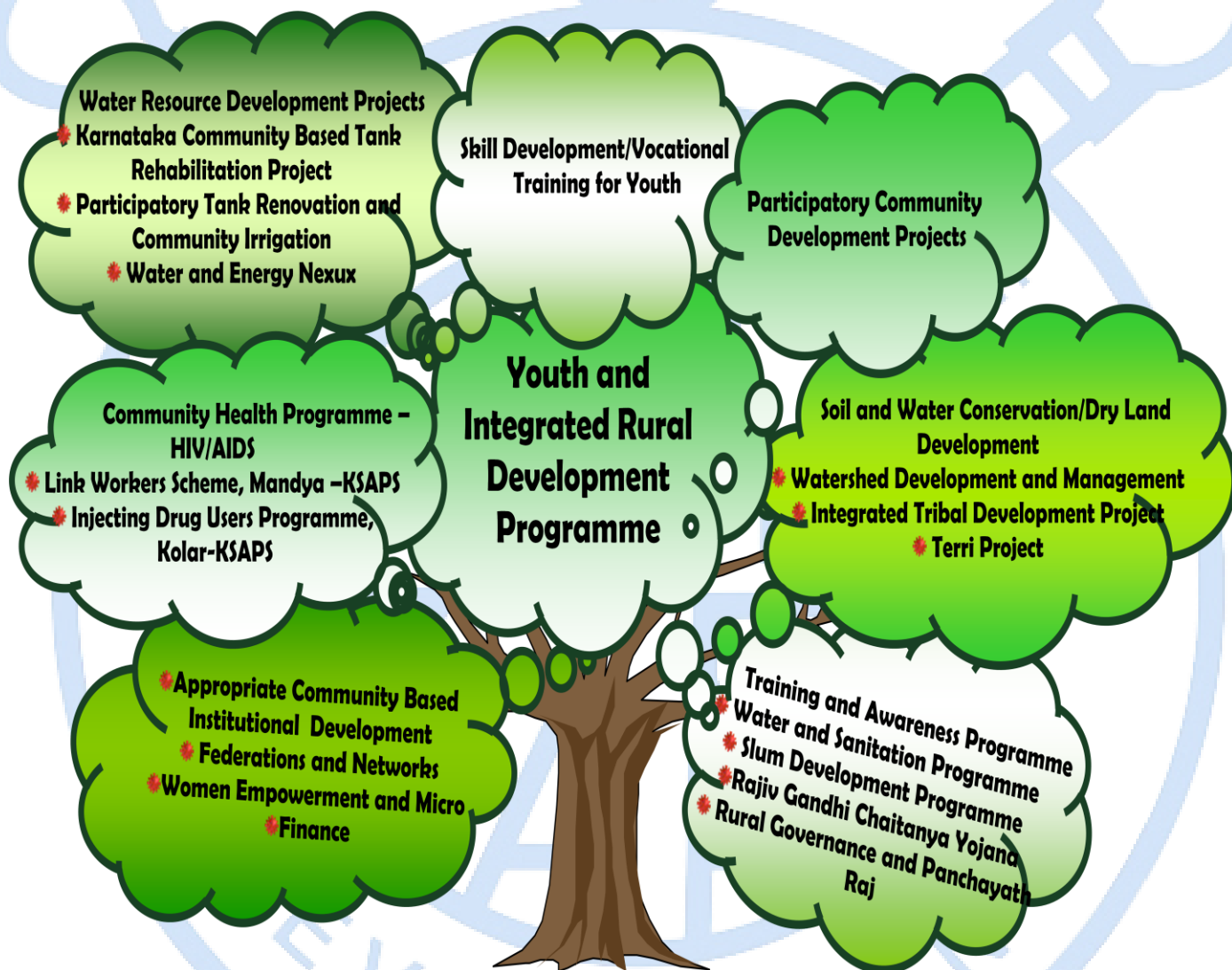

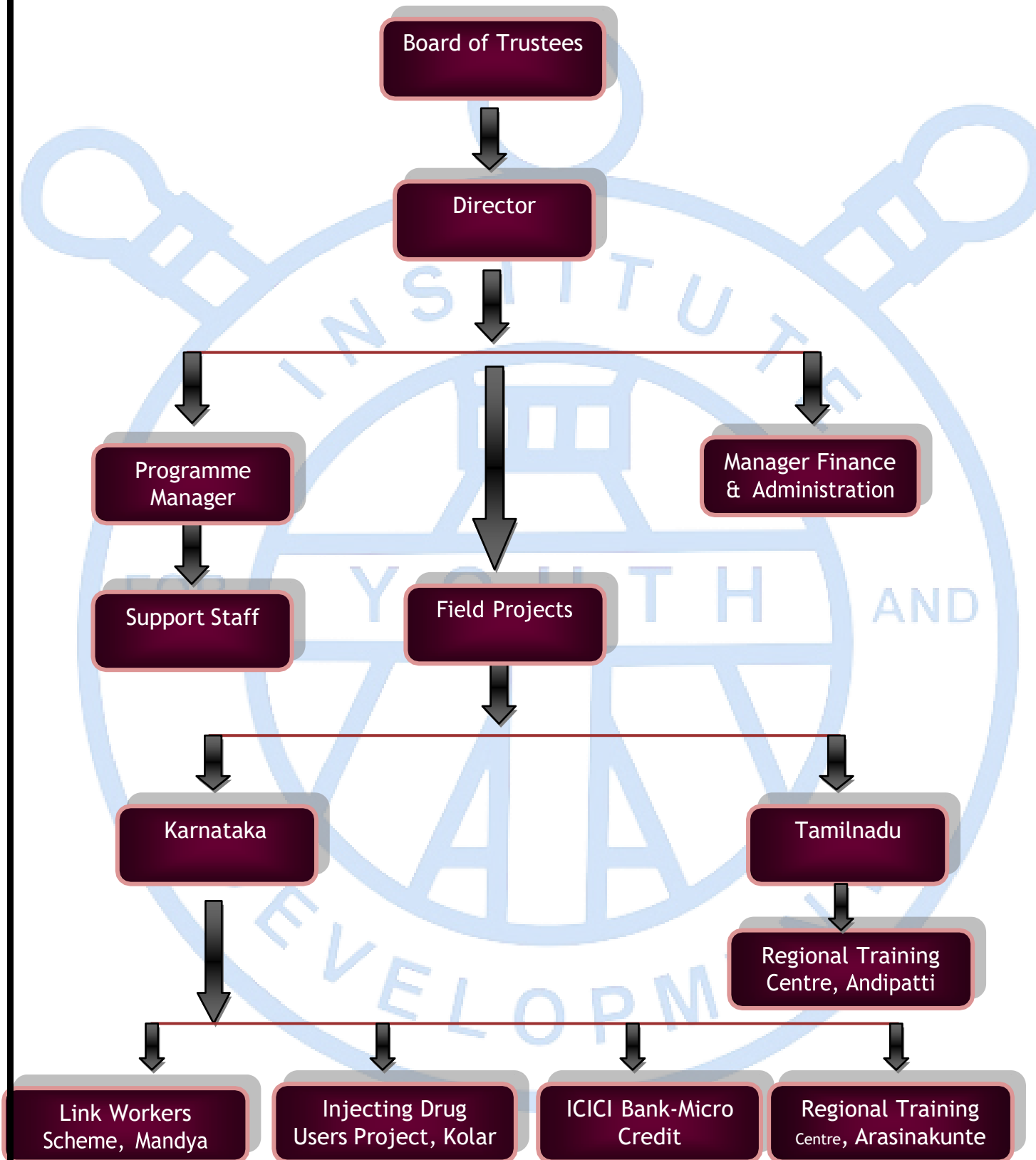

**A. Link Worker Scheme (LWS)** in Mandya District supported by KSAPS. This is an on-going/continuing project since 2017 and based on the evaluation outcome/performance, the contract is being renewed every year.

**B. Injecting Drug Users Targeted Intervention/ WE CARE (IDU-TI)** programme in Kolar District. This is an on-going project from 2011. Every year the contract agreement is renewed based on annual performance evaluation by NACO/KSAPS. It is being supported by KSAPS.

**C. Micro-finance support to Self Help Groups** with the Credit support under bank linkage development from ICICI Bank. This is also a continuing programme. In this programme IYD's role is that of a business correspondent.

## PROGRAMME IMPLEMENTATION IN DETAIL:

### A.Link Worker Scheme (LWS), Mandya :

Main aim is prevention from HIV/AIDS. India has the third largest HIV epidemic in the world. HIV prevalence in India is estimated at 0.3% (2.1 million people are living with HIV). Sex workers and men who have sex with men are among the key affected groups, along with people who inject drugs. Transgender people are emerging as a group at high risk of HIV transmission. Migrants and long distance truckers continue to act as bridge population/fuelling HIV epidemic.

#### Project Goal:

The major goal of the Link Workers Scheme (LWS) is to reach high risk groups and vulnerable men and women in rural areas with information, knowledge and skills on HIV/STI prevention and risk reduction. The programme components include:

- ✚ Increasing the availability and use of condoms.
- ✚ Establishing referral and follow up linkages for treatment for STI's, testing and treatment for TB, ICTC/PPTCT services and HIV care and support services including ART.
- ✚ Creating an enabling environment for PLHA's and their families reducing stigma and discrimination against them through interactions with community based structures/groups.

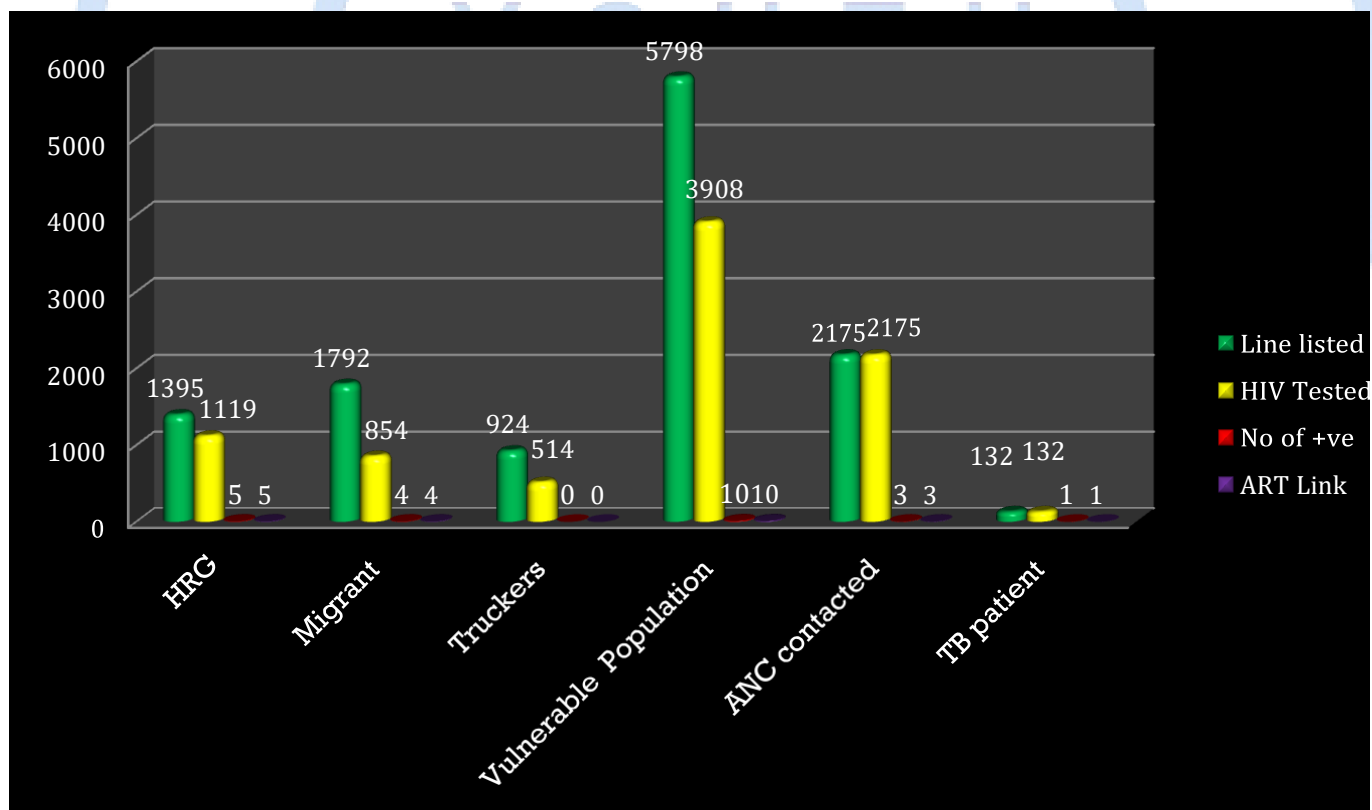

## Accomplishment Details of Outreach Activities:

- Covered 1395 HRGS against the Target of 1395. In which ICTC tested 1119. Found 5 positive and linked to ART.
- Covered 11 MSM against the target of 11. Out of which 7 are ICTC tested members and found 0 positive.
- Covered 924 Truckers against the Target of 924. In which ICTC tested 514 members. Found 0 positive.
- Covered 1792 Migrants against the Target of 1792. In which ICTC tested 854. Found 4 positive and linked to ART.
- Covered PLHIV 665 against the Target of 665. Out of which linked 30 members for social benefit schemes.
- Covered ANC 2175 against the Target of 2175. In which ICTC tested 2175. Found 3 positive and linked to ART.
- Covered 132 TB against the Target of 132. In which ICTC tested 132. Found 1 positive and linked to ART.
- Covered VP 5798 against the Target of 5798. In which ICTC tested 3908 members. Found 10 positive and linked to ART.

## Community Programs:

### Village Level SHG Meetings cum Awareness programme:

- Participated 64 numbers of taluk level "SHG Awareness programme - Mandya 8, Pandavapura 4, Madduru 12, Malavalli 2, Nagamangala 6 and KRPete 30. 963 SHG members participated totally. The main aspects covered during the said programme were COVID – 19 preventive and control measures, HIV, TB and STI related issues. Displayed Amma Movie, Link worker program, HIV Awareness and village level health activities and ICTC Camp plan. Distributed about 1000 numbers of IEC materials.



## VHND Meeting” (Village Health Nutrition Day):

- Participated in 67 numbers of “VHND Meetings, KR Pete 5, Mandya 8, Malavalli 7, Madduru 12, Pandavapura 15, Nagamangala 7 and Srirangapatna 13. 1272 VHND members attended the meeting. The discussion points were COVID-19 precautionary as well as control measures, orientation about Link workers program and village level health activities plan.



## ICTC Health Camp:

Conducted over all 97 numbers of ICTC Health Camps in our working area. During the camp tested 6462 members from the communities. In which FSWs were 754, Truckers and Migrants were 1534, VP were 2860, and other populations were 1308. Among the tested cases, identified 23 +ve. All have been linked to ART treatment. Besides this during these camps, we have tested BP (blood pressure), Diabetes for about 4880 people with the support of PHC staff.



## Migrants Awareness Programme:

Conducted Health Camps as well as Awareness programme for Migrants and Truckers in their work places and tents outside the villages where in covered HIVtest, BP, Diabetes and general health checkup. Distributed IEC materials.



- Participated 71 numbers of taluk level ASHA Meetings - Madduru 9, Mandya 13, KR Pete 24 Malavalli 4, Nagamangala 3, Pandavapura 6 and Srirangapatna 12. 1086 ASHA's attended the said meeting. During the meetings, discussed about Link workers program details, HIV Awareness and village level health activities and ICTC Camp plan.
- Conducted 4 numbers of PLHIV Awareness programme in which 97 Members participated. Attended Medical Doctors, ICTC Counsellors. The major aspects dealt with are Nutrition, Health, OI, Social benefit schemes aspects including mental health support.
- Participated in 39 numbers of numbers of GP Meetings and discussed about overall programme of LWS and HIV related aspects pertaining to Mandya District. Motivated GP Members to support for



additional needed IEC, Wall writing, Health and awareness camps as well as campaign.

- Participated in 31 numbers of taluk level “VHSC Meetings” - KR Pete 11, Pandavapura 6, Srirangapatna 7, Nagamangala 2, and Mandya 5. Altogether 507 members of VHSC Committee had attended.
- Participated in 18 numbers of ANC Meetings - KR Pete 3 Pandavapura 7, Nagamangala 6, Srirangapatna 1, Madduru 1. 332 ANCs attended the meeting where we discussed about Nutritional aspects and ICTC testing. Distributed 500 numbers of IEC materials.
- Participated in 19 numbers of “PHC Meeting” – KR Pete 5, Srirangapatna 5, Pandavapura 2, Madduru 3, Mandya 2, Malavalli 1, and Nagamangala 1. 351 members attended the meeting.
- Conducted Health Camps as well as Awareness programme for Migrants and Truckers in their work places and tents outside the villages where in covered HIV test, BP, Diabetes and general health checkup. Distributed IEC materials.
- Organized village level IEC campaign cum mass awareness programme regarding HIV/AIDs prevention, control and detection, availability of various health facilities, social benefit schemes, coordinated effects, ART, TB, STI, Use of Condom, HIV Act.
- Established Village Information Centres (VIC) especially in GPs, PHCs, Milk Diaries, and Libraries where large gathering takes place. These places we have placed stitched cloth bags with a number of pockets in it to place IEC materials for the easy availability of general public.

- Conducted 42 numbers of taluk level COVID-19 Awareness programme covering all taluks of our working area. The major area of focus was on building awareness on COVID – 19 symptoms, precautionary measures to control and prevent such as Social/ individual Distancing, regular washing of Hands, use of mask, up keep of health and hygiene.
- Created awareness by participating in SHG meetings, door to door visit, visiting work places.

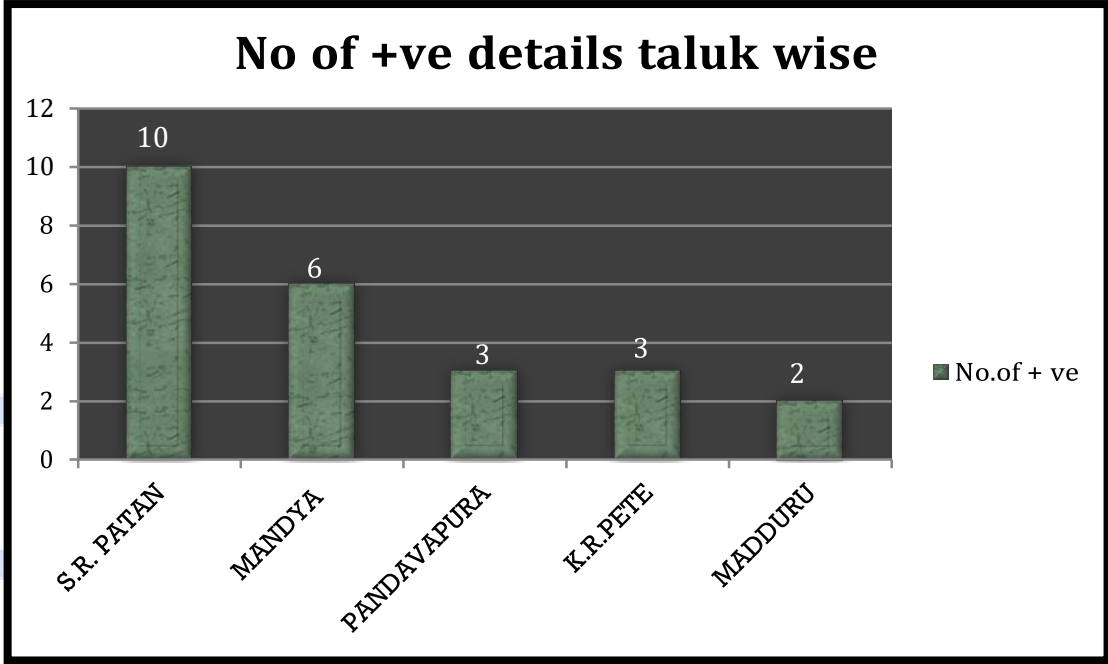
#### ■ **Grocery kit Distribution:**

The program was held on 10-06-2020 at the District Office and 15-6-2020 in KR Pete with the prime intention to support about 100 needy community members.

- During COVID -19 outbreak, our LWS team worked whole heartedly to reach the required medicine/treatment to the ART patients door steps even though there was restriction from the villagers to enter the villages.
- Arranged health checkups for migrants in their work places and tents outside the villages.
- During this outbreak our LWS workers have stitched masks and distributed free of cost in our working area.
- As a token for recognizing our link workers, we provided them with COVID warriors' badges to enter the villages.
- **Covid 19 Vaccine to our staff:** Government has recognized our Link workers as frontline COVID -19 warriors and 15 of them availed the benefit of COVID vaccine in General Hospital.

#### **Capacity Building programme:**

- Refresher training cum orientation programme to staff :  
Conducted 5 different sessions of refresher training cum orientation programme to staff to enhance their working knowledge and ability.
- Participated in District level monthly review meeting LWS Staff. This meeting usually works as meeting cum orientation where we review the progress, prepare and discuss future action plans, corrective measures/improvement in process based **on need etc.**
- Participated in DAPCU review meeting monthly.
- Participated in KSAPS JD and PO review meeting.
- Participated in NGO Review meeting.

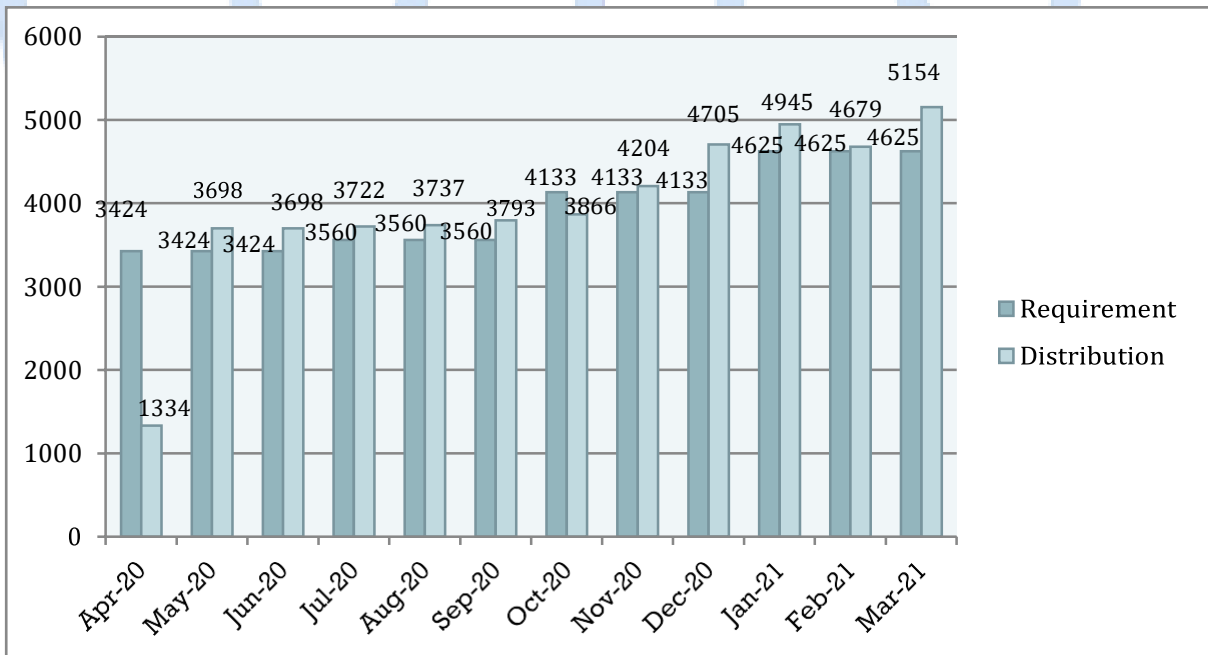

### **C. Micro-finance support to Self Help Groups by ICICI**

**bank:** IYD is the **Business correspondent** (BC) for ICICI Bank in the following locations - Doddaballapur, Devenahalli, and Nelamangala Talukas of Bangalore Rural District, South and North Talukas of Bangalore Urban District, and Pavagada Taluka of Tumkur District. During this year 139 Self Help Groups were financed with Rs. 6,37,96,704/-. 8.22% being the delinquency. The situation is a direct result of impact of Covid-19 on livelihoods.

### **D. Joint Staff Development Programme:**

Attended Virtual meeting on 27.10.2020 conducted by Konrad Adenauer Stiftung, New Delhi Office to discuss the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) Training manual and update each other on the developments of their activities of each partner Organisation. During the deliberations, New FCRA regulations and its impact was briefly discussed.

Attended Virtual Meeting on 15.12.2020 conducted by Konrad Adenauer Stiftung, New Delhi office to discuss about SDGs presented by Dr. Nithya Nanda Director, Council for Social Development.

Attended Virtual Meeting on 10.02.2021 to discuss about the Draft Manual on SDGs. The Partners participated in the meeting thoroughly discussed the manual in detail. Dr. Nithya Nanda shared his insights on the SDGs. During the meeting, the partners also discussed about the venue and dates for the upcoming JSDP meet. It was unanimously agreed upon with Udaipur as the Venue and 18<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> September 2021 being the dates. Miss Manda Parikh welcomed the proposal and assured all necessary

organizational work from her Organisation in making the programme a grand success.
